PP Comments 29/01/17

This week the children return to school and many people take up their occupations and duties. The regular challenges of daily family life and the many commitments that can often crowd a family's calendar compete for attention. It can be difficult to judge what is really important and what we can manage to squeeze in. This year the season of Lent is late and we have a few weeks, or in this case a month, to prepare for this season. Parishioners who would like to host or join a Lenten discussion/prayer group please let Sr Antonia know as soon as possible. Some groups meet regularly in the season – please let Sister know so we can order book and resources.

In taking up our regular tasks it is good to think of the parish community and ways to serve. You can see from the bulletin many different ways to serve and be involved in the life of the community. Last week we celebrate the Mass of Christin Burial for Mrs Molly Wark, a long-time parishioner and local resident. What was so strongly expressed by her family and by her life was her constant and committed participation in parish and community life. We can see from her lifelong sporting pursuits (played tennis till she was 88 years old), passion for hocky, involvement in the Catholic Women's League and legendary fund raising efforts, to her determination to attend Sunday Mass and participate in parish life—a life lived to the full.

We see in the scriptures this weekend the themes of commitment and involvement. Jesus in the Gospel puts his priorities out there for all to see and hear. His priorities are not those of the world but the inner qualities that speak of eternal truths and a life lived for others with compassion and mercy. The understanding of going up the mountain – the proclamation of what is important to Jesus and therefore to God contrasts the values of the world and of marketing and advertising. Where do we get our values? Principles? and our worldview? What is really important to us? What principles guide our lives?

Matthew writes to a community who are biblically literate. They know their bible and all he says in his writings reflect the broader scriptures and especially resonate with them are the references explicit and implicit to the Old Testament. In today's Gospel, there are many references to the Old Testament and Jesus sums up his teaching and how to live the Christian life in the words of the Beatitudes. We can see a similar reference in Luke 6:20-23. Matthew's teaching expands and enhances this teaching. He is talking about discipleship—our following of the Lord in our lives. This is a programme of a new Spirit in the Kingdom of God. This is the Spirit that should animate 'the children of the Kingdom'.




